Adjunct Professor for Arbitration

The University of Missouri School of Law is seeking an Adjunct Professor to teach **Arbitration** for the Spring 2022 semester which begins January 18, 2022 and ends April 29, 2022. The University of Missouri School of Law is a full-time J.D. and LL.M.-granting institution located in Columbia, Missouri.

Course Details: **Arbitration** is a 3-credit course that covers law, policy, and practices relating to the arbitration process as it is utilized in commercial and international sectors. Topics include modern arbitration statutes (e.g., the Federal Arbitration Act), enforceability of agreements to arbitrate, public policy defenses against enforcement of arbitration agreements, arbitrators and administering institutions, components of the arbitral process, arbitral remedies and awards, and the arbitration award in the courts.

Position Details: The individual will be hired to teach the course for the spring semester, provide a final exam that will be administered one day between May 3-13, 2022 and submit grades no later than May 27, 2022, and all other expected duties associated with providing legal instruction.

Qualifications: The individual must have a J.D. from an ABA-accredited law school, and practice experience in arbitration and related substantive areas is preferred. Prior legal teaching experience is valued.
